

ELECTRICAL WORK

A. General

COLLEGE POLICY REGARDING ELECTRICAL WORK IS:

WITHOUT EXCEPTION, ALL ELECTRICAL WORK WILL BE DONE ON DE-ENERGIZED CIRCUITS.

B. Lockout/Tagout

Before working on any equipment the maintenance technician should observe lockout/tagout procedures in accordance with OSHA Lockout/Tagout standards 29 CFR 1910.147.

C. Protective Equipment

All protective devices shall be readily available and shall be put into use to assure proper protection when needed.

D. Favorable Work Conditions

This means a dry working area, no storms in progress, adequate work space and minimum of exposed, energized equipment or conductors adjacent to grounded equipment.

Eye Protection - When working on energized equipment where making, breaking, shorting or grounding may result in a flash, eye protection must be worn. Also, proper eye protection must be worn when performing work that may result in producing flying particles.
