- Earn high school and college credits at the same time.
- Credits apply to an MCC certificate or degree program and easily transfer into bachelor's degree programs on the MCC campus or to other four-year colleges.
- Reduced or free tuition for McLennan County students can save you thousands.

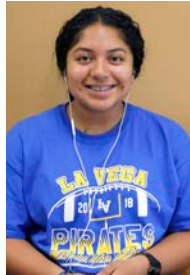
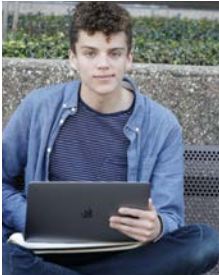
Who can enroll in Dual Credit courses?

- Dual Credit courses may be taken starting in the fall of a student's 9th-grade year.

What type of courses are offered through Dual Credit?

- Students may choose from basic courses that will transfer to a Texas public college or university bachelor's degree program, or workforce courses that lead to a certificate or two-year degree program.

Where are the courses offered for Dual Credit?

- Classes can be taken on your high school campus, on the MCC campus, or online.

How much do Dual Credit courses cost?

- Students that live in McLennan County pay \$77 per semester hour plus any additional course and lab fees. Tuition exemption waivers that cover tuition and fees are available and are based on family size and income. Waivers do not cover the cost of textbooks.

What services are available to Dual Credit students?

- Dual credit students have access to all of MCC's support services including transfer advising and free tutoring. Students are encouraged to use these services to promote course transfer to other colleges and personal success in courses.
