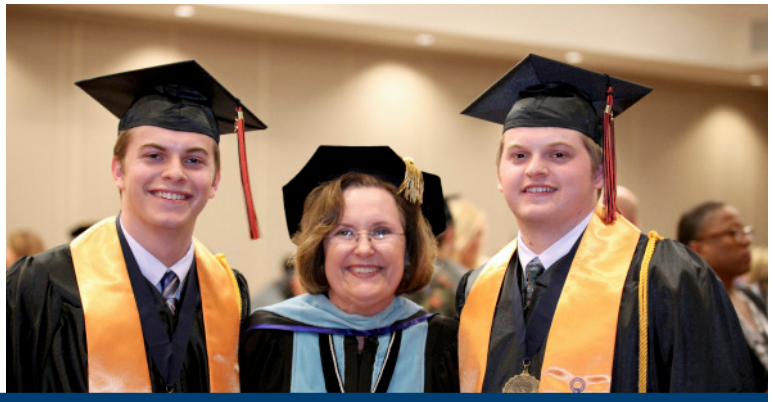

What We Do

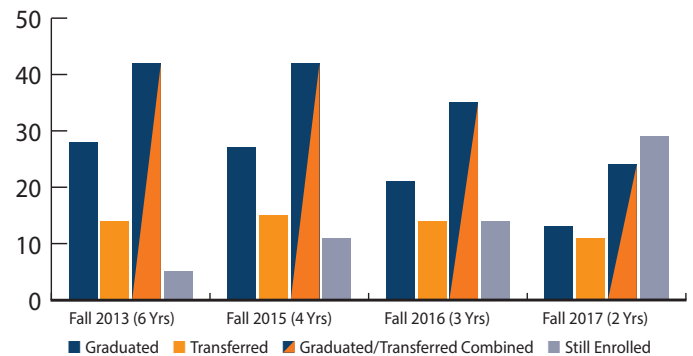
- Offer Associate of Arts degrees, Associate of Science degrees, Associate of Arts in Teaching degrees, Associate of Applied Science degrees, and Certificates of Completion.
- Offer Bachelor's and Master's degrees through the University Center with partnership institutions including Tarleton State University & Texas Tech University.
- Tuition & Fees: McLennan County Residents \$115 per semester hour (<http://www.mclennan.edu/tuition>)
 - Average cost of tuition & fees per year for McLennan County residents: \$3,450
 - About 70% of students receive some sort of financial aid
 - Institutional scholarship programs include the Honors College, First Generation, Merit Scholars, McLennan Scholars, and Presidential Scholars.
 - 400 additional scholarships are available each year.
