In addition to the immunization requirements, students must obtain and present the results of a drug screen and Texas statewide criminal background check. Certified Nurse Aide Training Course

Certified Nurse Aide: Your First Step in a Health Career. MCC is an approved provider of the federally required course for anyone wishing to work as a certified nurse aide (CNA) in a long-term care facility. This course provides information and training in basic nursing techniques. For the clinical portion of this course, students must have a dark green scrub suit, a watch with a second hand, and white shoes. State certification testing is scheduled as soon as possible after completion of class. The fee for state testing is \$83 and is required by the second week of class. Certified Medication Aide

Medication Administration for Nurse Aide

This course is designed to increase the accuracy and safety of drug administration to nursing home residents. Following successful completion of the program and required state testing, graduates will be listed on a central roster with the Texas Department of Aging & Disability Services (D.A.D.S.). Strict admission criteria apply. In addition to the immunization requirements, drug screen and criminal background check, the following prerequisites must be completed and presented at registration: (1) notarized high school diploma or GED, (2) current CNA credentials, and (3) a permission letter on organizational letterhead paper from a nursing home to perform clinical observation at its site (PLEASE NOTE - Student MUST be employed in a long term care facility on the first day of class).

Cost: \$325, 16 wks (140 hrs)

CMA Recertification

This course fulfills the state certification board requirements for recertification of CMAs. The course is required once yearly for all medication aides before their CMA license expires. Course meets last Thursday of each month. Due to state regulations, there is absolutely no admission to the classroom after 8 a.m. Bring pen/pencil, paper, current CMA license, and state-issued picture ID to class.

Massage Therapist

“Fast Track” Daytime Massage Therapy Program The massage therapy program covers the following: Anatomy, Physiology, Health & Hygiene, Hydrotherapy, Kinesiology, Pathology, Massage Therapy Techniques, Business Practices & Professional Ethics. At the end of 470 hours of didactic instruction, there is a 50-hour internship. During the massage therapy internship, students give hour-long massages to community members. NOTE: The times for the last 50 hours of class will be adjusted to fit internship requirements. Call 254-299-8888 to inquire about our "Phases Plan," which breaks the required classes into three distinct blocks to allow the student to pay for the course in increments.

Pharmacy Tech Review

This course is designed to prepare students for the national certification exam. It meets every other Saturday and every Wednesday evening. Tuition/fees include a background check, so that students may experience a pharmacy observation.

Activity Director

Activity Director

The activity director is the key person for providing quality-of-life experience for long-term care residents and clients. This course includes 100 hours of classroom information and 115 hours of internship. Students must purchase a textbook (approximately \$50).

EKG Technician

This course presents the principles of basic electrocardiography. Subjects include Anatomy and physiology of the circulatory systems, role and function of the EKG technician, safety and infection control, legal and ethical aspects in practice, and interpretation of basic and life-threatening arrhythmias. Successful completion of the class prepares students to sit for national certification. Students must enroll in both sections of the class.

Cost: \$340, 12 weeks (64 hrs)

Return to Nursing
