The 50th Anniversary celebration for McLennan Community College formally concluded Thursday, May 5 with the highly anticipated return of the Anderson & Roe Piano Duo to Waco. The night began with an elegant dinner at the Baylor Club, which drew 420 guests to a exquisite dinner with special guest speaker Dr. Betty Sue Marable Flowers. Flowers, former director of the Lyndon Baines Johnson Presidential Library, is the daughter of one of MCC's founding fathers, Paul Marable, Jr. Flowers recalled her father's legacy, noting that she did not know of his role in founding MCC until years later. Flowers was joined by her family members - her mother, Mrs. Paul Marable, Jr., and siblings Mr. and Mrs. Paul Marable, Mr. and Mrs. Rob Marable, and Mrs. Linda Marable Murdock. Other special guests included all three presidents of MCC: former presidents Dr. Wilbur Ball and Dr. Dennis Michaelis and current president Dr. Johnette McKown. Dr. McKown welcomed guests to the gala dinner before introducing Baylor University President and Chancellor Judge Ken Starr to give the invocation. MCC Foundation Executive Director Harry Harelik called special attention to Mrs. Millie Woods, who was the first student to register at MCC 50 years ago.

Before the guest artists took stage, the MCC Chorale performed the [MCC Alma Mater](#), which debuted this year at the Presidents' Concerts and Hall of Fame Induction Ceremonies on Oct. 10, 2015. The alma mater - MCC's first ever school song - was written by MCC's own Visual and Performing Arts Division Chair Rob Page, who retires this May after 35 years of service to MCC. Once the alma mater and acknowledgments were complete, Steinway artists Greg Anderson and Elizabeth Joy Roe took the stage with the Waco Symphony Orchestra. The duo masterfully crafted an arrangement of Camille Saint-Saëns' "The Carnival of the Animals," which was an audience favorite. Anderson & Roe Piano Duo performed three encore performances for their generous audience of nearly 1,000 attendees. McLENNAN ATHLETICS UNVEILS NEW SCOREBOARD

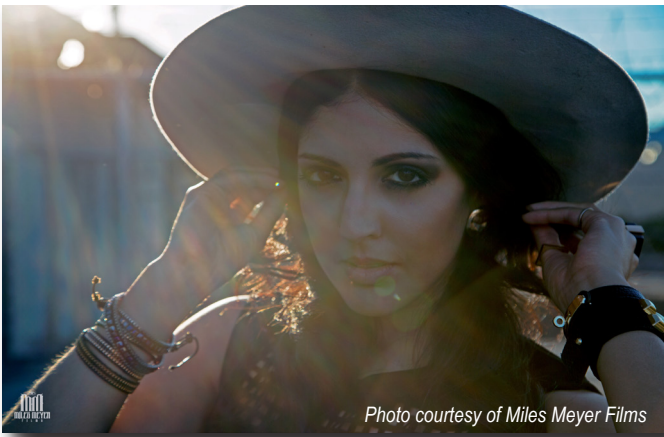

Q&A with Alumna Sirena Legend

Legend is half of rock duo Queen of Kings with her husband Auggie Del Rey. After beginning their performance career in Central Texas, Queen of Kings moved to Hollywood to further pursue the music industry. Q: How did you hear about McLennan Community College and what prompted you to attend?

A: I wanted to study music more in depth and had heard so many great things about the commercial music program at MCC. My passion led me there to become better.

Q: Did you have an extensive background in music prior to attending MCC?

A: Yes! I started singing and performing at the age of eleven. The following year I began to record in studios and learn about the gigging process. I got my start by singing in many churches around the Central Texas area and would sell my cassette tapes after each gig. Although I didn't fully understand the nature of the business, I loved every moment and everything I was doing.

Q: Briefly describe your experience at MCC - what were some of your favorite moments/classes?

A: I met some of the best musicians there and because we were such a close community, we learned a lot from each other, too. I loved the fact that I was close to most of the teachers and could learn in that type of environment. Clark Nauert took me under his wing and taught me many things about music, performing, and the business that you can't learn in a classroom. 'Til this day I consider him a great mentor. Beth Ullman also became a great tool, an amazing teacher and someone I looked to on how to elevate my professionalism. She knew my strengths, my weaknesses and saved my voice in so many ways. She pulled out the best in me and taught me how to constantly reach deeper within to consistently improve.

Q: How did the faculty at MCC prepare you for pursuing your dreams?

A: The music faculty are perfectionists and made sure I was on top of my craft - no doubt about that! The classes not only prepared me to master my musical skills but also to know the business side of the industry. Talent (working on your craft) and knowing the business go hand-in-hand if you want to have a long and successful career in the music industry. To this day, the faculty remain accessible and are always willing to help me, advise me and make me smile. I still keep in touch with several of them.

Q: What would you say to current and future students at McLennan Community College?

A: The music program is spectacular! The faculty and curriculum are among the best in the nation, but will not benefit you if you don't put in the hard work. Every day matters, whether you are in the classroom or not. You can build a solid foundation at MCC, but it is up to you to become the best in your field.

Q: What is next for you and Queen of Kings?

A: We always work diligently to be our best. We are writing, recording, and playing a lot of shows live in Hollywood. We moved here a year and a half ago with one goal...to be the very best and the number one duo in the world. Each step we take is with that goal in mind. And we have many fans to thank for growing this brand, this vision and this music!
