The MCC Foundation has been deeply involved in exciting preparations for several transition events over the next two months. These include:






Olson, Jr., and the ceremonial transfer of leadership. A reception will follow in the fountain plaza of the Community Services Center at 4601 N. 19th St.

three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality and justice for their spirits. I believe that what self-centered men have torn down, other-centered men can build up."

Building up others is evident in Curtis' work at Baylor, where she works tirelessly to explore leadership practices that advance a more just, equitable and participatory society, as well as encourage leadership by those populations that are more frequently underrepresented in such capacities.

No matter what her 8-to-5 job entails, Curtis says it is her personal responsibility to model civic engagement. She was awarded the Waco chapter of the National Association of Social Workers' 2004 Public Citizen of the Year and has been named a Woman of Distinction by the Girl Scouts of Central Texas. In addition to her MCC degree, Curtis earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communication from the University of Texas at Arlington and a Master of Arts in Sociology University. Making the Online World a Cleaner Place


In an effort to rid the online world of embarrassing posts from the past, the Highlander Alumni Association offered a free personal development seminar, "Cleaning Up Your Digital Dirt," June 17 in the Michaelis Academic Center.

More than 90 people packed the seminar to learn how to navigate the treacherous online waters where an innocently posted vacation picture or lighthearted comment on a social networking site can drown any hopes of a successful job search. Angie Nimmo, a career counselor with Tarleton State University, presented useful tips for finding, removing or burying information that can sabotage job seekers.

"If you think that employers are not looking (at such Web sites for information about job candidates), well, they are," Nimmo said. "Once you start your job search, every aspect of you has to be


Seminar participants were mostly students and recent MCC grads, with several faculty members, community members, and human resources professionals mixed in. Their opinions on the topic were as varied as their backgrounds, with some nodding knowingly at every tip, and others defending their right to "have a life" online that is separate from their professional life. Nimmo, however, disagreed.

"Employers will find any way they can to weed out the bad apples, so to speak," she said. "It's not that you're necessarily a bad apple, but you're doing them a favor by having this kind of information out there because then it's easier to weed you out." Among the tips:



- using first and middle names in any document that might be posted online to differentiate you from another "John Smith" who might not have a squeaky clean background
- seeking to "bury" negative items by populating the Web with current, flattering posts about your career achievements through blogging, a professional Web site, or news articles.
- Applying the "Grandma Test" to anything you post to the Internet from here forward. *Would you want your grandma to see this?*?

ESEC GRAND OPENING ANOTHER GRAND DAY FOR MCC



College leaders and the glitterati of the emergency services world gathered to celebrate the opening of MCC's \$14.5 million Emergency Services Education Center July 16 near the Waco Regional Airport.

The building features 10 classrooms, a 150-seat lecture hall, forensics labs, training rooms and a burn tower. Also housed at the facility are offices for City of Waco police and fire employees who will work with MCC staff and students studying in those academies. Such a city/college partnership is rare, and leaders from both parties marveled at what their joint efforts had built.

Aside from providing expanded educational and training opportunities for first responders, the building also is eligible to receive LEED Platinum certification in recognition of its environmentally friendly design and construction.
