#### MCC ALUMNI ASSOCIATION LAUNCHES

After years of waiting in the wings, the idea of an MCC alumni association came to life this spring to an overwhelmingly positive response.

The Highlander Alumni Association, built around a Facebook-style online social network, is a free service offered through the MCC

Foundation. It is designed to help former students, MCC staff and

employees and community friends stay connected. Membership is open to anyone with an interest in MCC.

"The potential is unlimited for this type of online interaction among MCC's huge network of alumni and friends," alumni outreach coordinator Kim Patterson said. "We hope that once people see how much the association offers, it will become a valuable tool for socializing, business networking and renewing contact with MCC."

While there has been talk of forming an association in the past and many departments have kept up with graduates, there has never before been a coordinated alumni outreach effort at MCC, Patterson said. However, after a year spent celebrating the college's 40th anniversary in 2006-2007, MCC President Dennis Michaelis recognized how rich was the college's history and how many people have been touched by it.

#### MCC STUDENT DEFIES THE ODDS, Continued

By the time he was 13, Brad's life didn't improve: his mother and stepfather were convicted of felonies and sent to prison. He moved in with his grandparents, only to endure more domestic strife. It was a turning point in his life that most adolescents would use as an excuse to venture further down the same self-destructive path.

was not like most young people. A few years after his parents went to prison, the 17year-old moved from Waco to Axtell and, as he puts it, "got around better people." Carolyn and Robert Walters accepted Brad into their home when he began dating their daughter Cecilia. Brad went to school, got involved in football and track, found a job, and studied hard. By the time he graduated-- 7th in his class -Brad had a plan for his life. It was a plan that would break the cycle of substance abuse, lawlessness, and neglect that seemed genetically programmed to rule his future. He was going to college.

When Brad started classes at MCC in 2006, he planned on earning degrees in

Real Estate and Business interned in a real estate office and only lacks the licensing exam to earn his Realtor's license. He is now just one semester away from finishing his business degree at MCC (with a 3.6 gpa) and transferring to Texas A&M to study Agricultural Business, Economics, or Accounting. For his entire two years at MCC, Brad has participated in the rigorous Tartan Scholars program, which provided full tuition and books and made his college journey possible. This spring, he took 19 hours and worked full time—the night shift—at Davis Steel Services (a division of Davis Iron Works), where he was recently promoted to the lead position over shipping and receiving.

Brad and his fiancé will be married on June 21. He plans to take the summer off from school, switch to the day shift at work, and prepare for his final semester at MCC this fall. His long-term goal is to be a motivational speaker and to use his remarkable life story to inspire young people who might be at risk. Brad can be reached at bradwetzel@gmail.com.
