# SCHOLAR BRUNCH & DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARDS

The McLennan Community College Foundation's Highlander Alumni & Friends Association recently hosted our Scholar Brunch. Considered by many to be one of the best days at MCC, our Scholar Brunch event sees scholarship donors and recipients sitting together for the joy of a good meal and great company. Many of our financial partners endow scholarships to commemorate remarkable loved ones. It can be deeply moving to see a legacy continue through the education of future generations.

Another component of this event is our privilege to honor two distinguished alumni for their exceptional achievements. Our Distinguished Alumni award is given to a college alum who has gone on to bring distinction to themselves and the college. Our Distinguished Leader award recognizes a recent MCC graduate who demonstrated excellence in their time as a student.

**Luis Jauregui received the 2024 Distinguished Alumni Award**. After moving from Mexico City to Waco to improve his English, Jauregui began his studies at MCC. He later transferred to Pan American University and then to Texas A&M University, where he earned degrees in Environmental Design and a Master's in Architecture. Jauregui founded Jauregui Architecture, Interiors, and Construction, which has grown into a multi-million-dollar company. He is a long-standing member of the American Institute of Architects and has held leadership roles, including serving as the 2017 President of Austin AIA.

Antonianett Garcia was honored with the 2024 Distinguished Leader Award. A Waco native and mother of six, Garcia began her educational journey at Christian Women's Job Corps during the pandemic, earning her GED in November 2020. She enrolled in MCC's Social Work



program in Fall 2021, maintaining a 4.0 GPA and graduating with highest honors in May 2024. Active in student organizations and a recipient of multiple scholarships, Garcia continued her education at Baylor University, aiming to work with incarcerated adolescents to support their rehabilitation and successful transition into adulthood. Antonianett was not able to join us in-person for the event because she is continuing her education at Baylor University, and had an important exam. However, she did share<u>this</u> video with the MCC Foundation and donors to share her journey and express her deep gratitude.

These awards highlight the significant impact MCC alumni have in their professions and communities, showcasing the college's commitment to fostering excellence and leadership. ## **ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: Jim Mikel**

McLennan alumnus, Jim\_Mikel, is one of only three robot choreographers in the world. His work has been showcased with Boston Dynamic's agile mobile robot, Spot. Mikel, a 1983 graduate of Connally High School and proud MCC Highlander, specializes in choreographing intricate dance routines for the robo-dog, and travels across the country inspiring students with STEM education.

Mikel's path to robotic choreography began after working with the Wounded Warriors project, where he witnessed firsthand the way robotics and prosthetics could help veterans. He explored robotics further, eventually developing performances blending technology, music, and art. He uses his talents to support various education initiatives including an apprenticeship program with the Department of Labor, providing students with opportunities to earn certifications in robotics, cobots, and drone operations.

Mr. Mikel is returning to the Waco area after years away. He is excited about getting involved in local STEM efforts, influencing robotics conversations, and contributing to Waco's growing technology sector.



## AN UPDATE ON CAMERON HALL

## 2024 KEN STARR MEMORIAL LECTURE

The world lost a passionate advocate for religious liberty when Judge Ken Starr passed away in September 2022. In honor of his legacy, McLennan Community College was privileged to host The Ken Starr Memorial Lecture on September 22, 2024. The event featured an engaging conversation with distinguished federal judges Don Willett and Brantley Starr, who shared their experiences in law, public service, and leadership.

Judge Don R. Willett, a Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals judge since 2018, has a storied career that includes service on the Texas Supreme Court and in various high-level legal roles. A dedicated public servant known for his wit and broad influence, Judge Willett has also contributed significantly to academia and public discourse. His counsel has helped influence and shape the the state and the nation.

Judge Brantley Starr, a U.S. District Judge for the Northern District of Texas since 2019, brings a wealth of experience from his work with the Texas Attorney General's office and his role as a legal scholar and community leader. After graduating from Abilene Christian University and UT Law school, Starr served as clerk to Willett at the Supreme Court of Texas. He went on to work with U.S. Supreme Court Justice Eva Guzman, and as Assitant Attorney General, Assistant Solicitor General, and Deputy Attorney General for Legal Counsel.

We sincerely thank the Starr family, donors, and sponsors for supporting this remarkable event, which provided students and the community with a unique opportunity to learn from two eminent legal minds. Events like these remind future generations that with perseverance and dedication, there is no limit to their dreams.
