### 2015-2016 SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

Applicants are evaluated based on financial need, academic merit, community service, essays and references. As of publication date, 379 scholarships totaling \$346,250 have been awarded for the 2015-2016 academic year. It is with great pleasure that we can report that the fiscal year that ended August 31, 2014, proved to be another period of happily unforeseen historical highs in several categories:

- 1) For the first time in history, net proceeds of the annual MCC Foundation golf tournament, one of the oldest continually operating fundraisers in McLennan county, exceeded \$50,000.
- 2) The largest gift in the college's and Foundation's history was announced. This gift, a bequest from the Estate of Iris Jeffress, widow of former McLennan Community College library director Victor Jeffress, is estimated at over \$1.8 million and will be used for a new endowed scholarship fund.
- 3) As a result of increases in market value along with the phenomenal Jeffress bequest, fund balances in the MCC Foundation surpassed the MCC Foundation Board of Trustees' enhancement goal of \$15 million, ending the year at \$15,550,526, an increase of \$3.9 million (over 33%) from the previous year.
- 4) Capitalizing on the fundraising, the Jeffress bequest, annual donations and investment market value increases, the MCC Foundation scholarship committee was able to award over \$320,000 in scholarships, a 28.4% increase in scholarships awarded in the previous academic year and a

### Q: How did you hear about McLennan Community College and what prompted you to attend?

A: I attended Midway High School and knew I could not attend college without financial assistance. Lise Uhl visited during choir practice one day and encouraged students to apply for scholarships to McLennan Community College from the arts department. I did and was awarded a Hearts in the Arts scholarship, which made going to college actually an option for me.

### Q: How did you discover your passion for opera?

A: My only musical background prior to McLennan Community College was choir. When I started at McLennan, I originally thought I would pursue linguistics. However, Ms. Uhl urged me to audition for the opera and I managed to get the lead even though I was not an opera major at the time. I knew my career path changed the first night of the opera when I

stepped on stage. I remember thinking: I have to do this ... this is what I want to do with my life.

### Q: How did the faculty at McLennan Community College help you succeed?

I was not a model student when I arrived at McLennan Community College. I built relationships with the faculty and came to discover that they understood and believed in my potential, and they also gave me opportunities to succeed. They frequently said, "no you can do better than this," and eventually I started to believe them and expect greater things from myself.

### Q: What was your favorite moment at McLennan?

A: All of the operas I performed in, of course. But I also enjoyed hanging out with friends in the LTC. My favorite opera to perform in was *Pirates of Penzance* because I enjoyed the collaboration between the music and theatre departments at McLennan Community College. That spirit of collaboration is unique to McLennan Community College and really built comradery amongst the cast and everyone involved.

### Q: What would you say to current and future students at McLennan Community College?

A: You have the opportunity to find and connect with mentors. Mine were teachers like Lise Uhl and Dr. Ruth Pitts. All of the faculty at McLennan Community College set high standards and give you the foundation and guidance needed to achieve. Some students might think of McLennan Community College as a last resort, but that is not what it is. McLennan Community College is a pool of extremely experienced and talented teachers who want to bring out excellence in each student on campus. And that is exactly what happened to me.

#### Q: What is next for Richard Leonberger?

A: I am currently pursing my doctoral degree at Louisiana State University. Right now I am focused on my dissertation: A Swann's Song in Middle Earth: an Exploration of Swann's "The Road Goes Ever On" and the Development of a System of Lyric Diction for Tolkien's Constructed Elvish Languages. I hope to complete my program in the very near future and begin teaching and performing opera.

### REMEMBERING "HILDA'S SUITCASE"

What encourages people to make plans for future gifts to a not-for-profit organization? One encouragement is learning from other donors' stories. Below is a meaningful story condensed from an article by fundraising executive Norma Cameron, originally appearing in the October "2010 Gift Planning in Canada" and reprinted in the U.S. "Advancing Philanthropy" Winter 2015 published by the Association of Fundraising Professionals. The story is called "Hilda's Suitcase." The story concerns the author's mother.

"I had no idea that my mother would end up teaching me a very important lesson about gift planning...despite my best efforts to raise the topic [of planned giving], she would say "I don't have very much, and when I am gone, I'm sure you'll all be able to work it out.".....Then one day, things changed---the day my mum told me the following story:

She was heading home from a five-day coach tour of Cornwall with four of her closest friends....They were having a particularly riotous time reliving one of their holiday highlights, laughing heartily, when suddenly Hilda, one of her oldest friends, slumped over her seat.....When the coach reached its final destination.....there my mother stood with her now only three friends, all staring at one [suit] case that no one picked up. It was Hilda's and no one really knew what to do with it. You see, Hilda was a widow with one estranged son who lived in Australia....And so they stood staring at that old brown suitcase.....

After my mother had finished telling me her story, there was a pause on the line, and she said, "When you come home.... do you think we could talk about, you know, those arrangements?"....After another shorter pause, she said that if she had a choice, she'd like to "go" the same way Hilda had, returning from a great holiday, surrounded by friends and spending her last moments on this earth enjoying a good laugh... For my mother, the time was suddenly right when she sat at home, not knowing what to do with Hilda's suitcase that now sat facing her on the living room carpet."

And so it goes for each of us...to, in the right time and before it is too late, make sure we don't leave a suitcase with which no one knows what to do. Making plans for the disposition of an estate is easier than one may think. Having a good, up-to-date will is essential, of course and, if there are charitable gifts to be made, being sure the charities are written into the will is essential. But charities can also be remembered as beneficiaries of life insurance contracts, retirement plans, charitable gift annuities such as those offered by the McLennan Community College Foundation and/or donor advised funds such as those offered by the Waco Foundation.

I, personally, have remembered the McLennan Community College Foundation and several favorite charities in my estate planning and Waco Foundation donor advised fund. I want to be sure those not-for-profits are supported after my death as they have been during my lifetime. Just because I pass away doesn't mean those organizations need my support any less. And just because I was supporting them doesn't mean my descendants and heirs will support them. But I can assure the support continues by planning ahead. I don't want to leave "Harry's suitcase" sitting on anyone's living room carpet.
