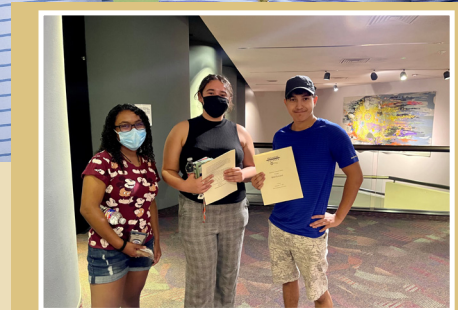

“We are so proud of MCC and all it does to help young people thrive,” said Teague. “Our dealership is blessed and glad to support great causes like this in our community.” The funds will contribute to the \$3.4 million campaign to repair persistent drainage issues and install artificial turf and add lights to enable night games at the fields. The improvements will support the success of student-athletes in the programs and enable the college to host high school, select, and college tournaments that will have an estimated \$2.9 million annual impact on the Waco economy.

Virtual Scholar, Donor, & Alumni Appreciation Event



Each September, the MCC Foundation honors our student scholarship recipients and their donors at our “feel good event of the year” the Scholar, Donor, and Alumni Appreciation Luncheon. Because of COVID-19 restrictions, we were not able to host this luncheon where scholars and donors meet in person, so we converted the luncheon to a virtual format for a second year.

At the virtual event, the Foundation announced we awarded \$488,725 in scholarships to more than 464 students for the 2021-2022 academic year. The Foundation also recognized 34 major donors who provided significant support to our college and students this year, as well as 37 new scholarship funds established.

MCC Foundation Wins Grant for Student Emergency Aid



The McLennan Community College Foundation recently was awarded a three-year grant for \$122,500 from the Greater Texas Foundation to participate in the Emergency Aid and Technical Assistance for Texas Community Colleges program. The grant will provide emergency aid funding for students, combined with technical assistance to establish or improve existing emergency aid programs.

Participating colleges were selected through a competitive process that was open to all public Texas community colleges enrolling 10,000 students or fewer, along with their respective foundations. Of those applying, only 10 were selected. To be considered, colleges had to identify a cross-campus team of staff who would actively participate in professional development and commit to matching a portion of the grant funding.

The MCC Foundation has had an emergency aid program in place since the late 1990s, established by College President Dr. Johnette McKown and her husband Dr. Stan McKown in memory of their two nephews who committed suicide within months of each other. They established the help fund so no student might experience that level of hopelessness due to life's unexpected emergencies. Today, the fund is also supported by MCC faculty and staff as well as community members and organizations who wish to help ease the financial struggle for students enrolled at MCC. The Foundation plans to use the technical assistance funding to streamline the emergency aid delivery process, implement marketing for greater awareness and increase the number of students served.

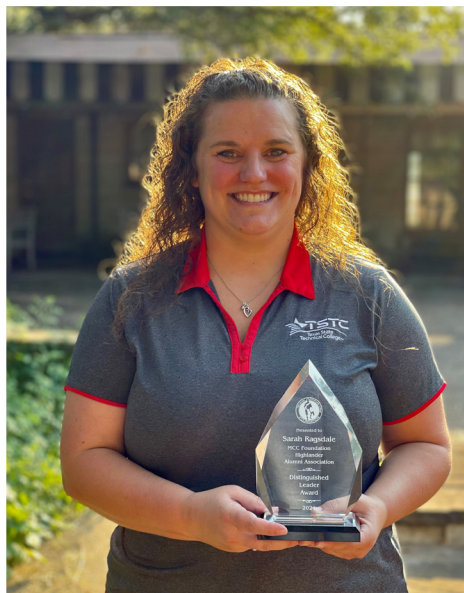
MEET OUR 2021 DISTINGUISHED HONOREES

Changing Three Lives

Childcare Grants a new program to support students and families.



Meet Maddie Ibarra, a McLennan student and recipient of the MCC Foundation's Clifton and Betsy Robinson Scholarship. Maddie says that having a Foundation scholarship has enabled her to dive into her studies in Social Work at MCC, earning a 4.0 GPA while being available to her son during his first year. Next year, when she returns to work, she also will benefit from a new donor-funded Child Care Grant that will help them enroll in the top-rated MCC Child Development Center.

During the peak of the pandemic, MCC volunteers began a calling campaign to reach out to students who had dropped their classes. Among the reasons for the dip in student persistence, volunteers found, was a lack of consistent and affordable child care.

Thanks to a generous donor, the new MCC Foundation Child Care Grant program is set to launch in January 2022. It will fund \$500 per month toward childcare for 10 months (January-May, August-December.) Our goal is to reduce financial and emotional stress on our student-parents by helping cover the cost of dependable care while they are in school and working. The response to the program was overwhelming: more than 70 applications for the grant poured in. We were only able to fund some of the applicants, but we see a real need that we hope to fill with future gifts.

Scholarships and child care support for excellent students like Maddie often mean the difference between a life unfulfilled and the dream of a better future. For Maddie, that dream is to become a case manager for Child Protective Services.

"I am passionate about children, and I want to be a voice for children who aren't as lucky as our son." After completing MCC, she plans to transfer to Tarleton-Waco to earn her bachelor's degree in Social Work.

Now, more than ever, a robust economic future for Waco depends on a well-trained, educated workforce filled with promising young professionals like Maddie. For many in our area, those opportunities would be out of reach were it not for the affordable excellence offered by McLennan Community College. We ask you to consider a gift to the MCC Foundation so access and opportunity remain open to every person who seeks them. A gift for scholarships, capital needs, or support services like child care grants, emergency grants, or Paulanne's Pantry all help students persist in their studies and contribute to an even stronger community.

P.S. Giving makes especially good tax sense in 2021: charitable gifts continue to be eligible for a \$600 above-the-line deduction against adjusted gross income for joint filers. For those who itemize, cash contributions to public charities are deductible up to 100% of your adjusted gross income. The MCC Foundation is also a qualified recipient of required minimum distributions from IRAs; such gifts lower taxable income for donors at least 70 1/2 years of age.
