2022 Award Recipients: Distinguished Alumni & Leader



The McLennan Community College Foundation's Highlander Alumni & Friends Association recently presented two prestigious awards to alumni of McLennan Community College: the Distinguished Alumni and Distinguished Leader awards.

Killian Hutchison of Waco was awarded the 2022 Distinguished Leader Award. Killian came to McLennan Community College as a Presidential Scholar. She maintained a 4.0 GPA during her time at MCC in the nursing program, all while working a part-time job, serving on the Student Advisory Committee, and volunteering at several non-profits in the Waco community. Killian did all of this during the midst of a pandemic, and during the peak of that pandemic she volunteered to help vaccinate our community. Killian is an all-around incredible person, and is the epitome of McLennan's drive to build future leaders and heroes. Killian will continue to serve our community as a NICU nurse at Ascension Providence.

Mandy Loftin-Conner is the recipient of the 2022 Distinguished Alumni Award. Mandy is a graduate of China Spring High School and attended McLennan as a Theatre student from 1991-1993. She continued her education at Texas Tech University. Mandy has taught locally for 25 years; during that time, she has earned 13 trips to Regional UIL One Act Play meets and eight trips to the State competition. In addition to

teaching and directing, Mandy is an established playwright. She has published the well-received play, *Lafayette No. 1*, which has been produced in 31 states, Canada and Australia. She has also published *AGO*, *Should Not Cause Harm*, *Unclaimed*, *Dirt*, 11 and *Rue*.

Most recently, Mandy partnered with Creative Waco to create a pair of life-sized Columbian Mammoth puppets that will be utilized by the Mayborn Museum and by the Waco Mammoth Site. Creative Waco's Executive Director, Fiona Bond, praised Mandy's creativity: "Mandy is deeply grounded in her personal faith and values. She embodies those values in her work and creative practice: inspiring others and giving those who feel unseen the opportunity to find their voice and shine."

The Foundation awarded a

record-breaking \$663,589

in student scholarships for the

2022-2023 academic year--the highest in our history!



On what we call the "Happiest Day of the Year," the McLennan Community College Foundation honored scholarship students and donors at the Scholar, Donor, and Alumni Appreciation Luncheon Sept. 14 at the MCC Conference Center. After a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. we resumed this wonderful in-person event where donors and their scholars meet and share experiences. And, we returned with a bang: we are delighted to announce that the Foundation awarded a record-breaking \$663,589 in student scholarships for the 2022-2023 academic yearthe highest amount awarded to students in the Foundation's 32-year history!

Also featured at the event was an interview with 2021 MCC Distinguished Alumnus Clint Lewis. Lewis was student body president when MCC moved from its temporary home at the James Connally Air Force Base to its beautiful new campus in 1969. After two years at MCC that he calls some of the best of his life, he completed his education at Baylor University and Baylor Law School

and has enjoyed a successful career as a Beaumont attorney. Clint and his family have endowed two scholarships at the MCC Foundation, the A.C & Ethel Mae Honea Scholarship and the Mr. and Mrs. William M. Lewis Jr. Scholarship. We congratulate Clint and remain so grateful to the Lewis family for its support of our students!

Also recognized were 14 new scholarship funds established and 40 major donors representing almost \$3 million in support for the Foundation, marking the most successful year yet!

The Foundation's scholarship application period for the 2023-2024 academic year opened Oct. 1 and is accepting applications through Jan. 15, 2023. A second application period will be May 1-15. Providing transformative opportunities through scholarships is the heart of what we do at the MCC Foundation, and we thank all our supporters for their commitment to this mission!

Cameron Revitalization 2.0

Project takes new direction due to cost by Kim Patterson, MS, APR; MCC Foundation Executive Director

This is a story of great dreams and unforgiving realities. For more than two years, a group of visionaries and MCC supporters have invested abundant time and energy into the revitalization of the historic William Cameron Summer Home on the MCC campus.

Envisioned as a community project, the College planned to restore the Cameron Summer Home property to its original glory for the community to once again enjoy. The McLennan Community College Foundation organized a steering committee of local leaders to assist with a capital campaign to raise funds for the project.

After hosting a grand kickoff at Clifton and Betsy Robinson's home in late June, we enjoyed great enthusiasm for the plan to honor Waco's past by restoring the Cameron home, historic courtyard, and grounds. At the time of the party, we hoped the project could be accomplished with about \$4 million, including a generous lead gift from the Robinsons for \$2.5 million.

In late summer, we received news that estimates to complete the renovation and interior museum development would be upwards of \$7 million. This estimate did not allow for any additional structural problems that might surface once construction begins. Shortly after, we learned of plans to reopen the Helen Marie Taylor Museum as a home for a Waco history museum similar to what we planned for the building. These two developments caused us to re-evaluate our plans for the project.

After exploring many options, it has been determined that the renovation of the 100-year-old home is ultimately not financially practical. While the concept has changed, the College has not wavered in its commitment to honor the amazing legacy of the Cameron family. We have now developed a plan to build a new structure that pays homage to the historic home and Cameron family, ultimately providing a state-of-the-art building on the site. The historic courtyard, home to many community memories, will be restored with lush gardens to complement the site. The new space will be called "Cameron Hall and Courtyard."

The McLennan Community College Foundation has committed to rallying support from private donors to fund the remainder of the project costs. Significant private donations and pledges have already been made. The new facility will provide functional space for McLennan Community College, house the McLennan Community College Foundation offices to support the mission of the College, showcase Cameron family history, and be a place for the community to gather for social and business events. With your support, we hope to re-engage a new campaign to raise the remaining funds soon.



The Cameron Courtyard will once again host business and social events.





The Cameron Summer Home was the creation of William Waldo Cameron. who succeeded his father as head of the family lumber business.

Built in 1922, the house was a wedding present from Cameron to his new bride, Helen (pictured above). This lavish wedding gift has endured a long history as a gift to the entire Waco community as home to many festive gatherings.

After William W. Cameron died in 1939, the house was sold, and McLennan Community College acquired the home in 1966 as part of the property purchased for the main campus.

Although its days as a private residence were over, the home became a different sort of home to the community, serving as the headquarters for the Art Center of Waco starting in 1970. Over the years, it played host to countless arts, social, and wedding events.

In 2017, despite renovation efforts over the years, the house began to show signs of its advancing age. The discovery of structural damage forced a sudden end to the home's use; revitalization efforts hoped to repair the damage and restore the home to its original glory.

While the original structure will not be restored, the new Cameron Hall and Courtyard will blend old with new and bring this beautiful location back to the community.

Dianne Ogden Memorial Scholarship makes first award

Hermila Gonzalez will never know Dianne Ogden, but thanks to Dianne and her newly endowed scholarship fund at the MCC Foundation, Hermila's life will be forever changed for the better.

Dianne worked as Director of Career Development at McLennan from 2000 to 2011. When she died that year, friends set up a scholarship fund at the MCC Foundation in her honor.

Friends say Dianne was a fierce advocate for children and a huge believer in mental health awareness and treatment, so the Dianne Ogden Memorial Scholarship is designed to support a student studying mental health, social work, or psychology.

Thanks to monthly donations from friends at MCC, the scholarship fund grew slowly over the years. In 2017, Dianne's friend and former MCC colleague Dr. Kent Hoeffner made a commitment to see the scholarship fully funded.

Thanks to gifts from Kent and others, this year the fund reached full endowment and the Foundation awarded its first scholarship to Hermila. On a very special day at the recent Foundation Scholar, Donor, and Alumni Appreciation Luncheon, Paul Hoffman and April Robinson got to meet Hermila and tell her about their friend.

"Dianne was generous with her friendship, and she was an adventurous soul who absolutely loved the beach and water sports," said April, MCC's Associate Director of Financial Services. April says Dianne enjoyed traveling to exotic beach locations all over the world, and her final resting place is in Roatan, Honduras.

"At the time I chose that location for her, the College had not yet started the annual TIDES study tours to Roatan, so it's nicely significant that even in death Dianne is close to MCC," April says. As a symbol of all that her friend loved, April and her daughter Sheridan carefully carried Dianne's shell collection with them on the plane to scatter with her ashes just outside the reef.

"How could I forget those shells-they were plentiful and very heavy and very meaningful," April says.

As for Hermila, she is grateful to know about Dianne Ogden and recognizes the impact this angel is having on her life. Hermila plans to continue her studies next semester at Tarleton-Waco to become a Child Clinical Psychologist.

Dianne, the fierce advocate for children, would be so happy.
