MCC hosted a groundbreaking ceremony on May 19 to celebrate the completion of the "Home Field Advantage" fundraising campaign and the beginning of work to improve the McLennan baseball and softball fields at the Bosque River Ballpark. The event included presentations from MCC Foundation Executive Director Kim Patterson, Athletic Director Shawn Trochim, and former Baseball Coach Mitch Thompson.

"Big dreams require great friends, and our community showed up in a big way to support McLennan's dream of having upgraded baseball and softball fields on par with other colleges in the state," Patterson said. The ceremony also recognized major donors, the City of Waco, the Cooper Foundation, the Paul McClinton Family, and Friends of MCC for their generous donations toward this project (see pg. 3 for the full list of donors.) Additionally, Patterson recognized Rick Brophy, who along with longtime MCC friend Bill Goss chaired the fundraising committee for this project. A the end of the presentation, it was announced that the McLennan baseball field will be named "McClinton Field" in recognition of the generous donation that was made by the Paul McClinton Family.

WHERE SHE GOT HER START: DR. LINDA SEWARD



A RECIPE FOR SCHOLARSHIP SUCCESS BRENDA BRADLEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP MAKES FIRST AWARD



Brenda Bradley was a longtime, beloved English teacher at MCC. In mid-2019, this vibrant woman was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, and she passed away on January 1, 2020, leaving behind so many friends, colleagues, students, her husband Randall, and their two teenaged children to grieve.

Soon after, Brenda's colleagues established an endowed scholarship fund at the MCC Foundation for students who want to major in English. To help with healing, and to help fund the scholarship endowment, Randall and close friends assembled a cookbook of Brenda's recipes; they distributed hundreds of copies for donations to the fund. Brenda was a wonderful cook who showed love through food, so the cookbook, titled *Bread for the Journey*, was perfect.



This fall, the MCC Foundation is proud to award the first scholarship from Brenda's completed endowed fund to MCC sophomore English major Haden Rhodes. Haden and Randall met at the MCC Foundation on August 11, and it was a special time for both men, especially due to numerous similarities for the families. Haden



shared that he is adopted, as are Randall and Brenda's two children. Both Randall and Brenda grew up on farms, and Haden and his siblings all work on the family farm near Bosqueville. The Bradley family also travelled extensively and enjoyed food and music from many cultures. That Haden was born in Korea made for another wonderful connection. When he completes his studies at MCC, Haden plans to transfer to Texas Tech.

"Brenda would be especially pleased that Haden is adopted and he lives on a working farm. I was quite taken by the many similarities with Haden's background and ours," Randall said in a Facebook post that garnered almost 700 "likes" and 98 warm and loving comments.
