

FOOD PANTRY RECEIVES \$5,000 GIFT FROM ATMOS ENERGY



"This gift will do so much to help us serve students who are working hard to support themselves or a family while they attend college," said Foundation Executive Director Kim Patterson. "Hunger is a real issue on college campuses, especially at community colleges where many students live perilously close to the edge of financial security. We are incredibly grateful to Atmos Energy for their commitment to support our students."

Thanks to its supply partnership with the Central Texas Food Bank, the MCC Pantry will be able to provide meals for up to 200 students with the gift, said Completion Center Associate Director Natalie James. Students who access the pantry are typically limited to one visit per month and are provided with coaching to help with accessing other community resources. Each pantry visit provides enough food for three meals for a family.

Paulanne's Pantry was named in honor of Waco resident Paulanne Ream Hoover, who left a gift to the MCC Foundation in her estate plan. This gift funded an endowment to cover basic costs of Pantry operations as well as establish one of the first scholarship funds for part-time students at the college.

MCC Recognizes Local Leaders With Arbor

The Greta and Murray Watson, Jr. Arbor project was conceived and funded through the generosity of Brazos Higher Education Service Corporation, the student loan financing company founded by Murray Watson, Jr. in 1975. Among other gifts, the company and the Watson family have funded more than \$579,000 in endowed scholarships at the MCC Foundation to support the McLennan Presidential Scholars program.

To honor its founder's lifelong support of higher education, Brazos and the Watson family wished to create an outdoor space where students, faculty, and staff at the college could gather. The company's generosity means that no college funds were expended for this beautiful campus enhancement. Since its opening, students have flocked to the space.

"We are so grateful to our friends at Brazos Higher Education Service Corporation and the Watson family for their generous donations to our campus and student scholarships. This space will provide an area where our students are able to relax, study, and find tranquility in their busy schedules," said MCC President Johnette McKown. "This is the perfect tribute to the Watson family that cares so deeply about students and their success."

Iglehart Scholarship Honors Family Legacy

East Side Fish Market, 1980



Dr. Alfreda Iglehart is a Waco native who now serves as Professor Emerita of Social Welfare at UCLA. She recently approached the MCC Foundation about creating a scholarship in honor of her parents, who were the owners of the East Side Fish Market at 803 Clifton Street. According to Dr. Iglehart, at the time of her father's death, the market was the

oldest continuously operating African-American business in Waco. The Dr Pepper Museum recognized Henry Iglehart as a notable Waco entrepreneur with a display in 1999.

Iglehart Wedding Day March 26, 1946

Both of Dr. Iglehart's parents were incredibly committed to education, and she says MCC has been a major part of her family's life. She attended MCC during the summers when

she was home from college, and the MCC summer courses enabled her to graduate from St. Mary's University in three years. Her sister, Angela Iglehart Woods, completed her first two years of college here before transferring to Baylor. Her brother, Randall,

also attended MCC when he was home from college, and her sister, Cathy Brown, received her AA degree from MCC. Her nephew, Daniel Iglehart Brown, is now an MCC employee.


The fish market was situated in front of the



family home on Clifton Street. After Henry passed away, Willie Iglehart had the building razed so she could have a front yard. The family home is still home for Daniel and his mom, Cathy.





Spring brings a time of excitement, renewal, and anticipation. At the Foundation office, it also brings a feeling of gratitude and perspective. When the students submit their thank you letters, we get to see how appreciative they are and how much a scholarship means to them. It reinvigorates the staff and reminds us why we do what we do every day! The events and fundraising we do allow our donors and partners to change lives and we are honored to be a part of that process. It is truly a fulfilling and uplifting time in the office.

With the first round of scholarships offered, more than \$458,000 has been awarded to 358 students for the 2022-2023 academic year. The second competition will be open from May 1 - May 15 and can be accessed during that time at this link - https://mclennan.academicworks.com/users/sign_in.





The MCC Foundation has been working diligently to streamline the emergency grant process and the timeframe for students receiving funds. Since the beginning of the academic year, we have removed the requirement for recommendations from staff or faculty and implemented the availability of issuing Wal-Mart gift cards (which cannot purchase alcohol, tobacco, firearms, or lottery tickets.) Working closely with Financial Aid and the Business Office, we have doubled the number of available disbursements each week. We have also tweaked the application and are in the process of surveying students who have accessed the new application to learn about their experiences.

MCC was recently named one of six colleges in the United States to recieve a Basic Needs Grant to address food, housing, transportation, and health needs among our students. In coordination with the Basic Needs staff, we have recently implemented a food voucher system that provides a hot meal to students on campus. While the college has a food pantry available and twice-monthly distributions from Shepherd's Heart, sometimes students need an immediate meal. These vouchers allow students to access a meal from one of the three food areas on campus. The Foundation also will begin funding a pilot project for snack stations around campus this summer.

We are also very excited about the pilot childcare program launched with support of a generous Foundation donor. Six students are currently in the program that provides a \$500 monthly benefit for each child that is enrolled in a DFPS licensed childcare center. Funds are paid directly to the facilities. Students must be taking a minimum of six hours and have at least a 2.5 GPA to be part of the program.





This spring marked the launch of a new partnership between Waco ISD and the MCC Alternative Teacher Certification Program: Grow Your Own! Funded through gifts to the MCC Foundation, this program provides \$5,000 awards to WISD paraprofessionals who wish to pursue a teaching certification through the alternative program.

The first cohort of three WISD paraprofessionals started in March and will wrap up in Spring of 2023, allowing the students to begin their new careers in the Fall of 2023. Each year will have a new cohort of up to eight beginning in the spring. The MCC Foundation is proud to help WISD support its most promising paraprofessionals while helping them move up to teaching positions.







This spring, MCC Foundation Board Members Len Brown and Missy Larson are taking advantage of horseback riding lessons at the MCC Highlander Ranch! Len is riding "Lights on Broadway" (Molly). Molly was donated to the MCC Foundation in 2019 and has thrived as a teaching horse at Highlander Ranch.

MCC's 200-acre Highlander Ranch is located in Bosqueville (223A Cobbs Lane), about five miles from the college's main campus. Services available to the community include horseback riding lessons, camps for children, equine boarding, and numerous Continuing Education courses. Highlander Ranch is also home to MCC's Veterinary Technology and Agriculture associate degree programs, as well as the Veterinary Assistant certificate program. Several facilities are available for rent, including a large covered arena, meeting rooms, pastures, and a large tree-covered picnic area.
