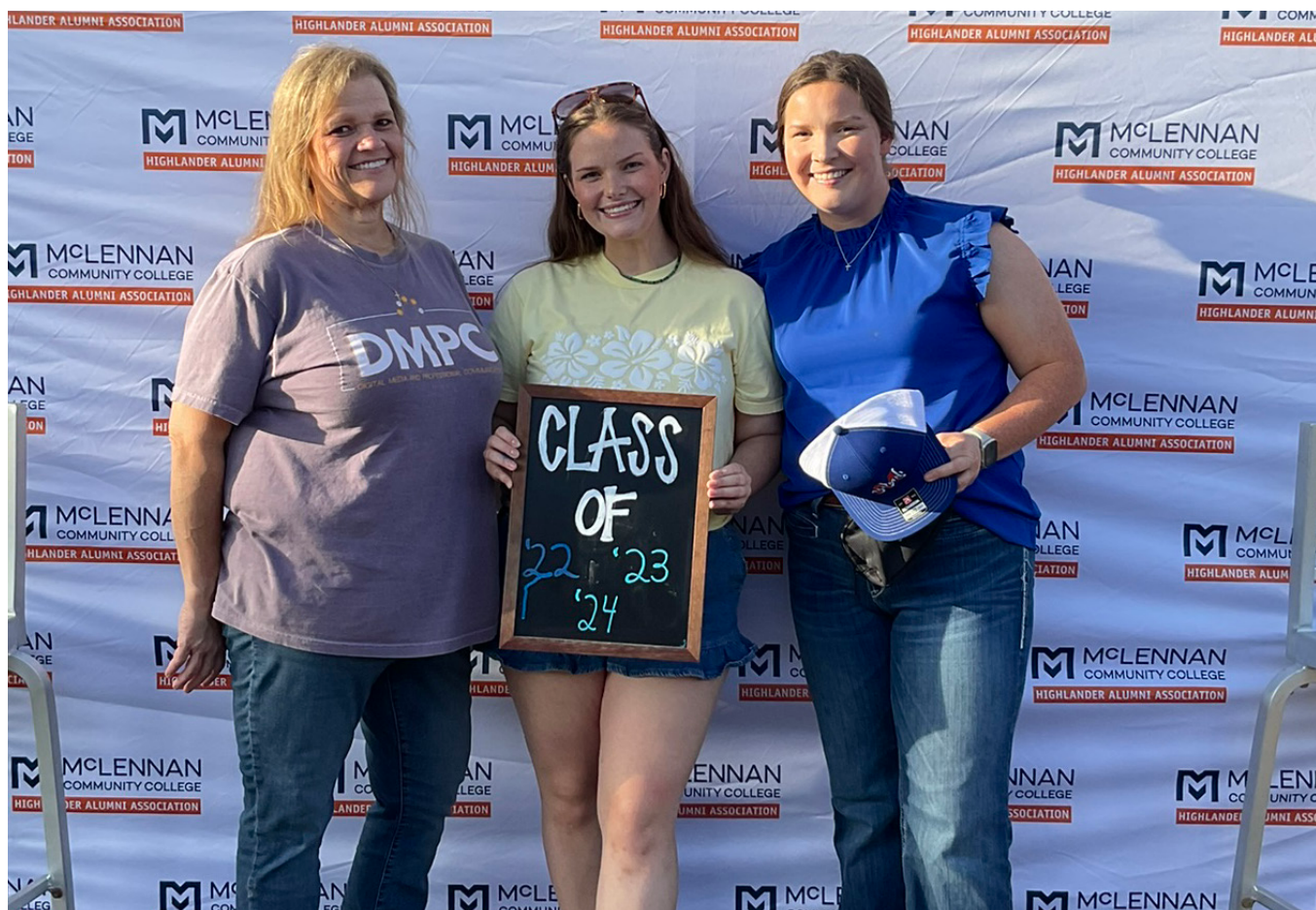
HIGHLANDER PRIDE SHINES AT 17TH ANNUAL ALUMNI & FRIENDS REUNION

GRAMMY WINNING HIGHLANDERS

This year, **three MCC alumni walked away from the 67th Annual Grammy Awards as winners!** While it is no secret that our Visual and Performing Arts department is second-to-none, these prestigious awards and the outstanding artists who claimed them speak volumes about the quality of education at MCC!

Ruthie Foster, who has earned several Grammy nominations through the years, was this year's winner in the category "**Best Contemporary Blues Album**" for her recently released work, Mileage. Foster has said that she always wanted to attend Berklee, but ended up at MCC, which she has called "Berklee on the Brazos".



Larry Griffin Jr., known professionally as Symbolyc One or S1, is a record producer from Waco. He studied audio engineering at MCC, where he graduated in 2010. He has worked with artists like Kanye West, Beyonce, Eminem, Erykah Badu and others. He has worked on many Grammy-winning albums and certified platinum tracks. This year, S1 was recognized alongside Erykah Badu for her song, 3, which won in the category "**Best Melodic Rap Performance**".



Percussionist **Deacon Marrquin** has been nominated for three Grammy awards during the course of his career, according to the Grammy's official site. In February of 2025 he took home his first Grammy alongside Lucky Diaz & The Family Jam Band. Their album Brillo, Brillo! was recognized as this year's "**Best Children's Music Album**". Marrquin has also been honored several times by the Latin Grammy awards for his excellence as a drummer and percussionist.



These alumni demonstrate the level of excellence present throughout all of MCC's educational programs, and especially the outstanding quality of our arts.



AN UPDATE ON CAMERON HALL

With the help of partners like you, we are thrilled to be finalizing the construction on Phase I of our [Cameron Hall](#) project. Aimed at rejuvenating a historic community gathering place, the Cameron Hall project has been years in the making. Many community leaders, and many of you, joined us early on this project, inspired by a vision that bridges McLennan Community College to our community's past while inspiring the future for countless students. We couldn't be more grateful.



Phase I of this project includes a world-class event space with beautiful windows overlooking the greater Waco area. Expert designers have incorporated many elements of the original Cameron Family Home, including art deco fireplaces, terracotta roof tiles, Roman Tuscan columns, and plenty of gorgeous natural light. This elegant event space will be available for our community to use as a place of gathering and celebration, a hallmark of this building for roughly a century! Also included in the first phase of construction are new offices, from which the MCC Foundation expects to secure immeasurable support for students in the coming years.

Perhaps most exciting is the **Cameron History Wall** planned for the building's main lobby area. Everyone who enters this building will pass by a meticulously curated exhibit detailing the history of the property, from the ownership of the Cameron Family, to its many years as the home of the Art Center, and beyond. This display collects beautiful historic photos and stories that have never before been shown in one place, sharing the exceptional stories, not only of the building, but also our community's shared history.



Phase I is not the end for this exciting addition to campus and the community. **The MCC Foundation has begun to raise funds for Phase II of the construction,** which will include improvements to the historic courtyard, excellent landscaping, and an executive conference room, all of which will add significant capacity to the event space. **To fully fund this second phase of the project, we are hoping to raise another \$2 million, total. Significant progress has already been made toward this goal, and we still have several naming options available.**

TENNIS COURTS



The eight regulation tennis courts on MCC's campus have recently undergone a complete overhaul, including expert resurfacing, coloration to match the U.S. Open's iconic blue and green, improvements to the nets and net posts, minor landscaping improvements nearby, and we aren't finished yet.

Recently, the College chose to add painted lines for two pickleball courts alongside two roll-away pickleball nets. We are excited to share these new additions to our beautiful campus, and look forward to countless hours of movement and recreation for the students, campus, and community.

This campus enhancement is the result of a multi-faceted partnership including the Coco Gauff Foundation, United States Tennis Association (USTA), and Waco Tennis Association. The College is thrilled to offer a free-to-use resource for competitive and tournament play, as well as additional opportunities for pickleball in our community. The courts are free to use and available on a first-come-first-served basis.

These courts provide a free and safe place for several high school tennis teams to practice and could be made available for planned tournaments upon request made to the president's office. BRIAN AYNESWORTH

Brian Aynesworth III and his wife of 33 years Sarah Lewis Aynesworth have lived in Waco, TX for most of their lives. Their oldest son received his associate's degree from MCC in 2017 and is currently the Chief Marketing Officer/Co-Owner of a rapidly growing e-commerce firm. Sarah has been an Etiquette Consultant for over 30 years and has worked extensively with MCC staff and students. She attended MCC in 1988 and graduated from Baylor in 1992 (BS). Brian attended MCC in 1985, then graduated from Baylor in 1989 (BBA) and 1991 (MBA). He has enjoyed a 35-year career in commercial banking. In 2003 he co-founded Independent Bank which later became Independent Financial, and pursuant to the sale of the company in January 2025 ultimately became South State Bank (Winter Haven, FL). He also co-founded Capstone Mechanical in 2005, which currently employs 175 people.

JUDGE VICKI MENARD

The honorable Vicki Menard was the first female district judge in McLennan County history and the first judge in the 414th District Court. She was appointed by Governor Rick Perry in 2005 and served until her retirement in 2023. During her tenure, she also served as Local Administrative District Judge for the County. Judge Menard was active in the community serving as President of the Waco Rotary Club, on the boards of the Waco Symphony and the McLennan Community College Foundation, as well as Council Chair of the Litigation Section while in private practice and involved in the Bell and McLennan County Bar Associations. She also served on the District Grievance Panel. Prior to taking the bench, Judge Menard was the managing partner of her firm in Waco.



KAY OLSON

Kay Woodward Olson is a dedicated and passionate community leader, supportive of arts, education, and social causes throughout the greater central Texas area and abroad. Her leadership has contributed to the success of organization like the Bullock Museum, Texas State History Museum Foundation, Texas Cultural Trust, and many others. She has been instrumental in supporting MCC's "Steinway" series concerts and played a vital role in our earning the distinguished status as an "All Steinway School". Her passion for cultural and educational experiences makes her excited about serving students, the college, and the community in this role.
