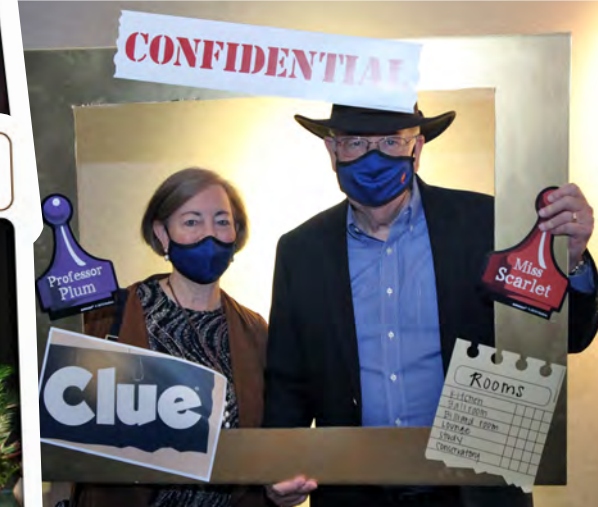

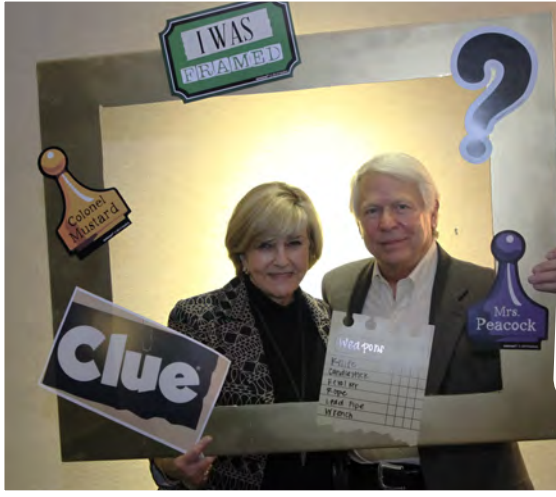

The 2021-2022 scholarship application period ended on January 15, and the scholarship committee members have started the review process of approximately 500 applications. The scholarship committee includes faculty, staff, and MCC Foundation board members who work under the guidance of Scholarship Coordinator, Shelley Cotten. We appreciate the scholarship committee for the work they do to match students with scholarship awards. For the 2020-2021 academic year, the MCC Foundation awarded 496 scholarships totaling \$445,471!

Since Sept. 1, 2020, 28 new scholarship funds have been established at the MCC Foundation. Scholarship awards would not be possible without the generosity of our donors who believe in the life-changing work performed each day at McLennan Community College.

Adjunct Instructor in Mental Health/Social Work

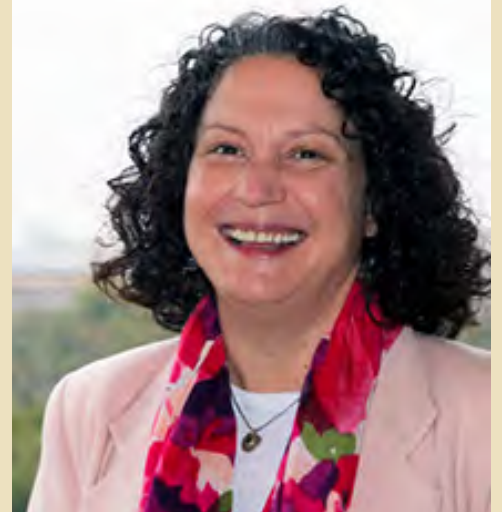
A note from her nominator:

MCC Foundation Grants Update



McLennan Community College was recently awarded \$112,500 as part of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) Texas Reskilling Support Fund Grant Program. This program aims to help Texans affected by COVID-19 including displaced workers needing to gain new skills to re-enter the workforce and also support students that left their pursuit of higher education before receiving a credential. MCC students who are interested in this program should complete the Reskilling Fund Application during the advising process.

Additionally, the College received \$599,594 in funding from the Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) Program of the U.S. Department of Education for the first year of the College's Title V project entitled "First Year Focus: Developing Academic and Co-Curricular Student Support Structures to Improve First Year Outcomes". The College will receive a total of \$2,901,555 over the next five years to continue developing this project. The project focuses on increasing the average first-year course completion, persistence, graduation, and transfer of Hispanic, low-income, and first-time-in-college students.

ALUMNI EMPLOYMENT PLACEMENT RATE FOR 2018-2019



The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board conducts a study each year that requires institutions to complete an Adult Learner follow-up report. The McLennan Office of Institutional Research and Effectiveness tracked the alums of 32 MCC programs. Their study revealed that 27 out of the 32 programs had over a 90% education or employment placement rate, and 16 programs had a 100% placement rate.

If it is true what they say about being known by the company you keep, then McLennan Community College is in very good standing with very good company. Recently, the MCC Foundation has received two major gifts from community friends who wish to honor loved ones and support MCC through naming campus features.

Greta and Murray Watson, Jr. Arbor

Since his passing in 2018, the Foundation has been working with friends and family of former state senator Murray Watson, Jr. to honor his many contributions to education in our community. This project included a generous gift from Brazos Higher Education Service Corporation, the company founded by Mr. Watson, to support students in their pursuit of higher education.

As we considered various campus locations to honor Mr. Watson and his family, we proposed a structure similar to the Highland Arbor that has been so well received by faculty, staff, and students since it was completed in Fall 2019. Highland Arbor was funded entirely with donations from vendors and the family of Charles and Mary Evans, who loved McLennan and the work we do to change lives. Similarly, the “Greta and Murray Watson, Jr. Arbor” will be funded by the Brazos gift to provide students a place to gather, rest, and enjoy the beautiful McLennan campus. The site for the new arbor is in a highly visible and well-traveled space near the Enrollment Services Center and the Michaelis Academic Center. As we write this, the college’s Associate Director of the Physical Plant, Brian Renegar, is gathering construction bids, and we anticipate a late spring ribbon cutting. The arbor will be a fitting tribute to the Watson family and a permanent symbol of their deep care for students.

Alice M. Starr Plaza

Anyone who has met Alice Starr knows that she does not do anything just a little; she gives her all to everything she undertakes. This passion for community and helping others has guided her efforts well before and since the Starrs arrived in Waco in 2010 for her husband Ken to assume the presidency of Baylor University. In the years since, the Starrs have come to love McLennan Community College, and they have been central in bringing speakers to our campus that elevated the college in the public’s and students’ eyes. They also have been extraordinary hosts for our Presidential Scholars on their study tours to D.C., affording them the opportunity to meet with Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts, Justice Brett Kavanaugh, and to have an insider’s tour of Mount Vernon where Alice served on the Advisory Board.

Through a gift structured to support Presidential Scholarships, Ken Starr will honor his wife’s support of and enduring work with so many community organizations, including McLennan, Talitha Koum, Baylor Nursing, Central Texas Food Bank, Waco Symphony, and others. As part of this gift, college leadership has voted to name the plaza located at the center of campus between the Administration Building and the Ball Performing Arts Center in honor of Alice M. Starr. This plaza is a lovely gathering spot for students and it is frequently featured in McLennan “glamour shots.” We plan a community ribbon cutting for the new “Alice M. Starr Plaza” on April 19.
