- Completion of BIOL 2401 Anatomy & Physiology I, with a 2.5 or better
- Completion and timely submission of the PTA application packet
- Applicants are STRONGLY encouraged to complete all 5 of the general academic prerequisite courses prior to applying to the PTA program.

How to Apply

- Completed MCC application forms and official transcripts to the Office of Student Records
- Completed PTA application and official or unofficial transcripts to the PTA Program Director
- Completion and verification of 40 hours of volunteer/observation or work experience in two different physical therapy settings using the MCC/PTA Physical Therapy Experience Form
- Two completed MCC/PTA Basic Workplace Skills Assessment Forms
